Public Transport

If you don't ever use public transport then you may ignore this section. However, if you wish to fly with your dog it is wise to practise on public transport where you can.

Remember that many planes are accessed via steep open stairs. You will need to ensure that your dog can handle these.

Your dog must approach a bus or train in a calm manner beside you. Achieved

When entering a bus or train your dog must not push ahead of you. Achieved

Your dog must sit on the floor out of the way of other passengers. If you have a tiny dog, he may sit on your lap. Achieved

Whilst in transit your dog must remain calm and not seek attention from passengers, try to look out the windows or bark. Achieved

When leaving the bus or train your dog must be calm. He must not jump out ahead of you. Achieved

Public restrooms

Always use the wheelchair accessible toilet when available.

Your dog should enter calmly and sit. Achieved

When you use the hand dryer, your dog should not startle or show fear. Achieved

Stairs

Your dog must walk calmly at your pace whilst moving up and down stairs.

Your dog must walk up stairs with open treads without fear. Achieved

Lifts should not be used if you have suffered a trauma or injury involving lifts. Your dog should enter and leave the lift in a calm manner.
