Basic Good Manners

Control of your dog on the leash

Your dog must walk next to you in a calm and relaxed manner on a loose lead. Achieved
Needs work

Your dog must walk next to you in a calm and relaxed manner when passed by another dog. Achieved
Needs work

Your dog must not sniff objects or mark whilst on the lead Achieved
Needs work

Your dog must stand quietly beside you for one minute when you drop the lead. Achieved
Needs work

Recall

Drop the lead . Ask your dog to wait, move away incrementally in a safe fenced area.

Wait for a short while — count to 5, then work up to 10, 20 then call your dog to you. Achieved
Needs work

Drop the lead. Ask your dog to stay, move away incrementally in a safe fenced area.

Wait again and build up tolerance to 20, 30 seconds then return to your dog and release and reward. Achieved
Needs work

Sit and down

Your dog must sit on cue for at least 1 minute. (Greyhounds are excepted from this rule) Achieved
Needs work

Your dog must do a down for at least 1 minute. Achieved
Needs work

Car travel

Your dog should always be calm in the car. He shouldn't put his head out the window or bark at traffic or other dogs. Achieved

Open the car door. Your dog must stay in the car until given the cue to get out. Achieved
Needs work

Once out of the car he should stay beside you and not run off. Achieved
Needs work

He should not be distracted by or react to a passing dog. Achieved

Entering a building

When going through a standard house door your dog should step back and let you go first. Achieved

When going through an automatic door, he must stay calm and at your side on a loose leash Achieved
